

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My Corvette addiction started in High School reading Street Machine magazines. A poster of a highly modified white C3 was used to cover my school folder. Later, there was the magazine's giveaway car photos, of another C3, black and pinstriped, decorating my first bachelor pad. I just wanted one.

This was pre-internet, so I bought a book, the Corvette Buyer's Guide and researched the best I could. I realised I really liked the original 1959 C1 and also most of the C3 models. As a 4th year apprentice, I decided a C3 was all that was in my budget, maybe? My ultimate Corvette was, and still is an original 1959, but on my wage, a C3 was still awesome. I could always swap to a '59 later in life.

I joined the club in 1991, a 21-year-old hoping to get contacts and information on how to get my own C3. I met Frank Rejtano and his mates at Eastern Creek Race Track when it first opened, and was hooked after Frank took me for a hot lap of the track, in his modified Corvette, the famous JAFFA. I sent my membership form off the very next day, apparently, I was member number 14.

My 1974 Corvette was purchased back in 1992 when I was 22, a first-year tradie. I sold all the toys I owned to buy a total mess of a car; it needed a lot of work. Most of my friends thought I was mad, but a select few could see my vision. I spent the next 14 years slowly rebuilding and customising this car, an off-chassis resto using any spare time and money I had whilst living a pretty busy life.

I used to go to as many Corvette shows as I could. I'd drop in, briefly say hello to people in the club, then disappear to do my research, sourcing ideas from other people's rides. My goal was to build a custom C3 with all my favourite features of each year model. At every car show I would research a different part, wheels this time, paint colour next, badges for the rear, engine accessories etc etc.


MY-074 was finally registered in 2006, with most work done by yours truly, and a very select band of friends. I learnt a lot about C3's and the joys and heartaches of building one from the ground up. During this rebuild time the NSW Corvette Club was awesome for contacts, recommendations and technical help. My only regret is, I should have participated in more runs. Even though I didn't have a car on the road all that time, I now know I would have been more than welcome to join in. I'm sure a few more lessons would have been learnt and some restoration mistakes avoided if I had talked to more people who actually owned and drove Corvettes.

Since its' 2006 registration, this car has done very limited km's. With raising family, weekend sports etc, the Corvette has done mostly small local trips around Wollongong. I had threatened to sell it, thinking 'use it or lose it', but my wife wouldn't let me (legend). I'd still swap it for an original 59, in a heartbeat, but ultimately would have both. As the kids are getting older, we do get the car out more now and are starting to rediscover this great Corvette Club that I have been a very small part of for the last 29 years. Hope to meet more of you soon out on the road and at car shows.

For your information, below is a summary of the build and some lessons I think worth sharing.

- **Rebuild time = 14 years - there is no time, you need to make time.**
- **CO\$T - we don't talk about cost - make a budget, then expect to blow it.**
- **Most work done by owner and - keep plenty of beer, and 'measure twice, cut once'**
- * **a few amazing friends (third attempt should be ok, be less fussy).**
- **Cars wear out sitting in the shed - cars need to be driven, drive it.**

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


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Finned aluminium valve covers were included on the 1958 Corvette fuel-injected engines? Note the ducting that fed air from the grille directly into the fuel injection system.



TREASURER'S Report

Please find in the magazine a copy of a spreadsheet covering condensed trading from January, 2020 through to June, 2020, also a sheet of trading for July, 2020.

Most trading over this period is virtually either Magazine and Postage costs or the receipt of Renewals.

Our overall situation stands at \$51,819.24.

At the beginning of the year we had the usual cost for Post Box (increased), Web, Associations and Insurance, not that we will be getting any value from these with Covid-19 lockdown. At time of writing I still have a P.O box to clear and some cash and cheques to bank, that will be after I zip up for my run to the Covid-19 mall where St George is located.

For the astute amongst you it would be clear that the amount of subscriptions and advertisers do not pay for the eleven (11) monthly issues of our wonderful magazine. We are in the same boat as other Car Clubs, for example the Mustangs are well behind in the monthly mag/postage cost offset. Of course, we are posting out more since we have no meetings, coupled to the APO increase in Box rental and actual postage rates - not much, but over 12 months it adds up. You may have noticed some recent mags of 28 pages – this cost just \$100 extra, but again over 11 issues adds up to one months extra cost - \$1100.

I will be talking with other clubs to investigate the Magazine issues. We have plenty of options and to incur your wrath I will put forward a couple of scenarios.

1. Discontinue the printed Magazine.
2. Actively drive the E'mag scenario.
3. Change the paper, colour content, black and white content, size of paper, quality of paper.
4. Reduce numbers printed.

Of these, item 4 can be addressed immediately, we can reduce to a print run of 180 - currently we get 200,

roughly 180 are posted – left overs are taken by members including Jorge to give new or prospective members a copy free. We supply each advertiser and associated car club a copy as well, but I do crib a bit here – if an advertiser is a member, then I send but one copy. But of late I note that other Club mags are down to two, ie MOCA's "Pony Express", Chev's of Vic's "Bowtie" most have gone to e'mag and stopped paper print magazines or have cut us off to save costs.

Obviously all the above can only be considered once we get some stats and estimates covering the printing. We are pretty lucky here in that our printer is also our editor, so we get excellent value for money.

In the current financial situation, it is hard to keep advertisers or for that matter, get new ones. Obviously any changes I put forward above could impact on the willingness of advertisers to continue. The committee may need to consider a widespread re-vamp of rates or inclusions on our web as a normal deal when advertising in our magazine.

WE (and that includes YOU) - the Members out there, need to think about people you know who could benefit from an advert in our magazine. Please have a think and canvas your contacts and if you get just one, it would be greatly appreciated. Advertisers do not need to be a member, so please consider.

This great example of the 2001 hardtop Corvette Z06 is offered for sale, as I am now enjoying retirement and doing the inevitable downsizing of my toys. Always garaged and continuously registered since being imported and converted to RH drive by Performax in 2002. Kept by them as a director's vehicle for three years then sold to its 2nd Australian owner who moved abroad two years later, when he sold it to the current owner. I am a former president and current member of NSW Corvettes Club.

Affectionately known as the "Yella Terra", this Z06 has been in my care from 2007 till now. Purchased to participate in club level motorsport including supersprints, hillclimbs and motorkhanas, it has won multiple club and class championships with HSV Owners Club of NSW, NSW Corvettes, interstate Corvette challenges, and Corvette Nationals events. It has also claimed two NSW CAMS State Supersprint class titles, and third at Australian national level. It has never been involved in any collisions that I am aware of, either on or off the track.

Lap times: SMSP Gardner 1.43.5, North 1.10.3, South 1.02.2, Wakefield 1.05.8, Phillip Island 1.47.

This Z06 has also won "best Corvette" and class trophies at various car shows over the years, proving it also presents well cosmetically.

Throughout its time in motorsport, various suspension, brake system, cooling systems and engine refreshing changes have been made, not only improving the performance package, but also resulting in a car that is stronger, more robust and reliable and by far better handling than the factory original.

Not driven on the track since early 2017, it is used as a weekend road cruiser, and has only travelled some 2,000 kms since then. A few months before its last track outing, the engine received an overhaul and refreshing, with some strengthening built in to the upper cylinder area. Upgraded valve springs, Hypatech Chev pistons, Crow rocker trunion and bush kit, and mild streetable camshaft (Lunati VDLS-272). Otherwise factory spec original LS6 5.7Ltr Corvette engine tuned to 460 BHP at flywheel, in February 2016. Cooling systems fitted to engine oil, power steering, and transaxle with oversized power steer reservoir. Vented crankcase. Battery relocated to boot. Upgraded air intake, LG long tube headers and 4 x 75mm Borla Big Four exhausts. Stoptech 6 piston monoblock

front brakes and 4 piston rears with 350mm rotors all round. Braided hoses. Cobalt Friction street pads and race pads included. Yokohama AO50 R-Spec race tyres fitted to spare set of wheels. Michelin road tyres fitted to vehicle. Hotchkis upgraded front and rear sway bars. LG motorsports Camber/caster kit, bump steer kit. Front brake ducting. Coilovers with Bilstein shocks and Eibach springs all round, supplied by LG Motorsports of Texas. 250Kg downforce rear wing mounted to chassis.

Front and rear tow hooks. Race seat and harness included but not fitted. Harness bar with camera mounts and extinguisher installed.

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


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
