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

See you all soon - get your motor running, and join in. **JEFF**

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
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Happy New Year for 2023 - looking forward to seeing all old members and new at an event or Corvette Meeting at the Crossroads Hotel.

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

Supercars is poised to open the 2023 season in Newcastle and keep racing there for a further four years after applying for Heritage NSW approval.

March 10-12 date for the 2023 event has been confirmed.

Newcastle is to become the first round of the much-anticipated Gen3 era, with the new Chevrolet Camaro and Ford Mustang debuting in 2023.

"Supercars can confirm that permission has been granted with Heritage NSW for the proposed 2023 event date, and another four years of racing in Newcastle. "That permit would allow all key stakeholders, including Supercars, Destination NSW and City of Newcastle to discuss the future of the event beyond 2023.

Our club has been asked to provide 14 Convertible/Coupe Corvettes for the Chev Drivers in the upcoming Driver's Parade at the Thrifty Newcastle 500.

As part of the start to the Supercars season for 2023, they would love to have a car show for the entire three days and have a designated Secure area for club members to display their cars.

"If required, you will be able to leave your vehicle parked up".

IT IS NOT COMPULSARY TO HAVE YOUR VEHICLE ON DISPLAY FOR THE ENTIRE 3 DAYS, HOWEVER, IT WOULD BE GREAT TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE DISPLAY WHILE ENJOYING THE RACES.

The cars will have to arrive before gates open, and they must stay stationary until the completion of egress at around 6pm before they can leave.

They are looking to follow the same process for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, meet with a Supercars team member at 5:30 in the morning and then be escorted into position, they will be able to leave after the completion of the race at roughly 6pm.

Each vehicle that is provided for the event will receive a 3 Day General Admission Pass (\$132.00) to the event.

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From the Trea\$ury

The December reporting period is very quiet, but still had a few transactions;

First the Term Deposit account.

Of course the Term Deposit Account has no movement and still stands at \$41,411.04 and is due for renewal on the 25th March, 23. Indications at this time are that the Federal Reserve will again increase the Cash Rate, whilst this is good for us, not so for anyone with a mortgage, however, the first Tuesday of the month is our meeting day and also the day the Reserve Bank hands down its Cash Interest Rate review, hopefully upwards, then in March we can re-invest our Term Deposit at a higher rate, but at this time we need to consider the long term repercusions and ask the following questions.

- 1. Get highest rate for 12/24 months?
- 2. Get a shorter time 3 or 6 months at lower rate?

Number One above is fine if the economy goes into a small recession or resetting, we will get higher guaranteed return but are locked in.

Whilst Number Two gives a lesser return, but we are only committed for shorter periods and can respond to any money market changes which may effect us.

However, the elephant in the room is the "Nationals" and if we are locked and need up-front monies, we may invoke penalties to get funds.

My personal thoughts are that we re-invest at the highest rate for at least 12 months, also the amount should be limited to a value of \$40K, all excess and new earnings on 25th March, 23 should be rolled over into our everyday account. This should ensure we have sufficient funds to get over the Membership renewals period and associated slow payments.

Also many Advertisers have been allowed to slip in an effort to allow our loyal supporters to recover after Covid and aline back to a Financial Year of July - June. This will be difficult for our American Sponsers as they have already paid on their local Financial Year, thus we should leave them as is, and be grateful they always pay on time.

The everyday Account opens at \$6,095.07 with Debits of \$2,107.53, Deposits of \$757.04 and closes \$4,744.58.

Debits were: December Mag \$880, Xmas Prizes \$165.92, December Post \$159.56, Foreign Currency fee \$12, Badges \$825, Raffle prizes (Feb) \$45.05 and account fee of \$20.

Credits were: Wrigg Membership \$30, Crossley 2xMemberships \$150, ZIP Advertiser \$577.04.

Of course the above is correct at the time of writting, but by the meeting night the balance will be higher, by at least \$200 from two new members - Messers Fricker and Jennings. Welcome to the Club, hope to see you both at meetings and or runs.

No doubt you will have questions, and hopefully raise them at February Meeting, if not call me or bring your ideas along to the March Meeting especially since the Term Renewal is due 25th March, 23 and any and all input is appreciated - I'm not a bean counter so all help is very much welcome.

"H" Plates

Please be advised that the H-plate scheme is an ever- evolving beast.

The RTA will send you, YOUR cars "Conditional Registration" plus a copy of the "Historic Vehicle Declaration" proformas.

At this time you should closely double check all the relevant details on your rego form - I've personally had details left off and "eng #" put in the "Vin #" position, and believe me this took forever to have fixed correctly at the RTA Service Centre. BUT ! the RTA keeps on file all your last submitted forms and transactions, these can be retrieved within approx 30mins, and allow the data on electronic file to be updated and or corrected as required.

Now! on this form is the wording:

"INSPECTION OR DECLARATION REQUIRED", this when read with the info on the forms top LH corner states that all "Historic Vehicles" are to have an applicable declaration supplied stating this Vehicle is suitable for Safe Use. This generally indicates that a pink slip of the paper variety is required (not all inspectors have paper pink slips - most are direct electronic on-line).

HOWEVER - the above also states " that it is the resposiblity of the Owner or Applicant to ensure the vehicle is in safe operating condition" and if the club is more than two (2) years old, (as our club is) then the Owner may Declare in Section 3 the vehicle is safe and notarise and sign off. (ie. the responsibily is yours)

The "Club's" H-plate Registrar IS NOT a mechanic nor does the "Club" issue pink slips or declarations for Safe use of your vehicle. Either the Registrar or Sec will sign and notarise Section 4. - "Vehicle Eligibility" which covers the basic facts that YOUR car meets the basic eligibility for inclusion and especially that you are a "Fully Paid Member".

So at first glance the Scheme is getting better, but info from around the traps also indicate a tightening of the rules - ie if your vehicle has at manufacture two or three styles of OEM wheels and you have some other combination - you could be defected and registration cancelled or it now has AM side pipes fitted which were not originally OEM fitted. However, heaven forbid that RTA or Police ever get that knowlegable with our cars and their bibs and bobs.

Last note: If your membership lapses and you're involved in ANY car altercation, your Rego and especially your Green slip will be null and void, not to mention what will happen to your car's insurance.

So stay safe and ensure membership is paid by 30th June.

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Chevrolet Corvette E-Ray V8 hybrid confirmed for Australia

Chevrolet's fastest-ever Corvette, the all-wheel drive hybrid E-Ray, has been confirmed for an Australian launch.

After decades without a factory right-hand drive Corvette, Chevrolet is now rolling out every new variant of its sports car with a right-hook option.

The Chevrolet Corvette E-Ray – detailed here – is the latest member of the iconic sports car family to be revealed, and it's coming here.

"It is with great excitement that we can confirm that the next-gen Corvette, the E-Ray, will make its way Down Under. Stay tuned for more details," said a spokesperson for GM Specialty Vehicles (GMSV).

The company's local arm hasn't confirmed when we cam expect to see the E-Ray, the first Corvette with all-wheel drive and a hybrid powertrain.

Launched 70 years after the original Corvette made its debut at Motorama in New York City, the new E-Ray has a LT2 6.2-litre V8 behind the passenger cell rated at 369kW at 6450rpm and 637Nm at 5150rpm. It drives the rear wheels via an eight-speed dual-clutch transmission.

This is augmented by an electric motor producing 120kW and 165Nm. It is powered by a small 1.9kWh lithium-ion battery, and drives the front wheels. Boasting a total of 488kW, the E-Ray has a claimed 0-60mph (0-97km/h) time of 2.5 seconds, making it the fastest production Corvette of all time. Chevrolet is anticipating the car can complete the quarter mile (400m) in 10.5 seconds.



6.2-litre V8, and is capable of completing the 0-60mph dash in around 3.0 seconds.

The zestier Z06 uses a 5.5-litre V8 with a flat-plane crank rated at 500kW and 624Nm.

The car uses the front electric motor during "spirited driving", in low traction situations, and to enhance vehicle stability. The driver can tweak the amount of electric assistance used via one of six modes: Tour, Sport, Track, Weather, My Mode and Z-Mode.

There are also two driver-selectable drivetrain settings: Stealth, which permits electric-only driving at speeds up to 72km/h (45mph), or until more performance is required or the battery is depleted; and Charge+ that prioritises recharging the battery pack, presumably for later use on-track.



As we've seen in spy photos and configurator leaks, the E-Ray utilises the wider body configuration of the Z06. The aero package is largely carried over from the Z06 too, although some parts are colour-coded rather than black.

The E-Ray rides on a new set of five-spoke alloy wheels that are 20-inch up front and 21-inch at the rear, and are paired with Michelin Pilot Sport all-season tyres measuring 275/30 up front and 345/25 at the rear. The optional Michelin Pilot Sport 4S summer tyres are required for the E-Ray to hit the car's claimed performance numbers.

Stopping ability comes courtesy of Brembo carbon-ceramic disc brakes with six-pot calipers at the front, and four-pot units at the rear. Magnetic Ride Control 4.0 suspension with three selectable settings is standard, as is black badging and a full-length electric blue body stripe.



The E-Ray Performance App on the infotainment system can display output gauges for the V8 and electric motors, a dyno graph, or data from electrical system.

Available options include carbon-fibre wheels, exhaust tips, chromed badges, exposed carbon-fibre elements, multiple interior colour schemes.

While the E-Ray will be faster than its siblings, it is also considerably heavier, so it will be interesting to see if it as satisfying to drive. The E-Ray coupe has a dry weight of 1712kg, while the convertible with its extra structural bracing tips the scales at 1749kg. That's up to 185kg more than the Stingray coupe (1530kg), Stingray convertible (1576kg), and Z06 coupe (1560kg).

Despite the addition of an electric motor and battery pack, the E-Ray still has a storage space available underneath the bonnet.

US sales of the Corvette E-Ray begin later this year, with a starting price of US\$104,295 (\$149,300) for the 1LZ coupe, and US\$111,295 (\$159,400) for the 1LZ convertible. Stateside the slightly more powerful Z06 is US\$1005 (\$1400) more.

Chevrolet typically rolls out a succession of Corvette variants with the introduction of each new generation, and we don't expect the cavalcade of C8s to end with the E-Ray.

A report back in 2020, which correctly predicted the launch of the flat-plane Z06 and hybrid E-Ray, also said we should expect the return of the Grand Sport and ZR1 nameplates, plus a new flagship Zora.

The Grand Sport will reportedly feature a slightly more powerful version of the base Stingray's engine, along with bigger wheels and brakes and retuned suspension, while the ZR1 will reportedly take the Z06's 5.5-litre V8 and add a pair of turbochargers.

The Zora – named after Zora Arkus-Duntov, regarded as the "father" of the Corvette – will reportedly combine all the new elements of the C8 in one ultra high-performance package, with a twin-turbocharged 5.5-litre flat-plane V8, a hybrid system and all-wheel drive.

It will reportedly produce a stratospheric 1000 horsepower and 1000 pound-feet of torque, or 745kW and 1355Nm.

Subsequent to this report, Chevrolet has confirmed it will introduce a pure electric version of the Corvette.
